They achieved the Founders Award in insurance, the Columbian Award in service programs with a double accomplishment of the McGivney Award in membership.

I am certain that each Grand Knight would tell you that they had great support from their membership under the guidance of their program and membership directors. I'm sure also that each council would be happy to share with you that their successes started with an accomplishment that instilled pride in the council that ballooned into our Order's highest award.

The easiest accomplishment is the reporting of your service programs to achieve the Columbian Award. It's the most attainable because your council is active and you are already doing most of what's required. These service programs are why eligible catholic men want to join the Knights.....if only they are asked. However, 38 of 55 councils **Did Not** submit the Columbian Award last fraternal year. Your State Program Director James Cunningham, 870-258-3146; State Membership Director Jim Palmer, 501-230-1042; District Deputy and State Officers are at your beckon call to assist your council in turning this situation around and support your efforts to achieve any and all parts of Star Council.

### **Jump-starting this fraternal year is the establishment of two new councils:**

First, a warm welcome to our Hispanic Brother Knights at our first Spanish-speaking council, The Mexican Martyrs (El Consejo Los Mártires Mexicanos) **Council 14609**, in **Rogers**. Not resting on his laurels with Double Star Council at Bentonville, our State Hispanic Coordinator and Brother Ed Viera followed his passion to offer the benefits of Columbianism to the many Hispanics that are members of St. Vincent de Paul Church in Rogers.

Realizing the potential roadblocks, he wisely gained the support of Msgr. David LeSieur. He then sought the assistance of our Hispanic Development Field Coordinator Jose L Jimenez, PSD of Oklahoma and brought into the loop Grand Knight Paul Beauchamp of Rogers Council 06834, who both offered their support, assistance and guidance. District Deputy Mike Mitchell lent significant support as did PSD and New Council Development Chairman Jimmy McKinnon. All this support and brotherhood helped Brother Ed weather a sometimes rocky journey. And Brother Ed even let me attend two of his First Degree Exemplifications.

The Chartering Ceremony is scheduled October 12 at the 1:00 PM Mass at St. Vincent de Paul Church in Rogers to honor Christopher Columbus. Our State Officers, Directors and Chairmen are invited to attend and will affirm our commitment to Council 14609. I'm convinced this new council will grow significantly and is only the first of several more Hispanic councils in Arkansas this year.

Another big welcome goes to our twenty new Brother Knights in Scranton. This is the result of the hard work and enthusiasm of many, but especially Brothers Tom Schriver and District Deputy Charlie Ketter. They worked very hard to prevent forming a new council of transfers only. With their 41 transfers, the

Scranton council will start with 61 members to be known as the Father Abbot Rathael DeFalvo Council. They should acquire their council number later this week. The support of Father Barnabas Maria Susai aided immeasurably in making this a resounding success. Again, PSD and New Council Development Chairman Jimmy McKinnon filled in for me on a Thursday evening First Degree in Scranton.

District Deputy Charlie Ketter did this concurrently with setting up and hosting a 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Exemplification at Ft. Smith Council 00996 at 10203 Columbus Acres Rd. on Sunday September 7 with registration beginning at 11:30 AM. The new Scranton First Degree members, First Degree members from other District 09 councils, ten new members from our new Rogers council and seven from Jacksonville (going for another Double Star Council) will add yet another success to DISTRICT DEPUTY Ketter's resume.

I couldn't be more satisfied with the support I've received from the State Directors and Chairmen. Their enthusiasm, encouragement, commitment and support have helped our Arkansas Jurisdiction get off to a great start. But I'm most proud of the future leadership that is developing in our younger Brother Knights that will take Arkansas to new plateaus in the future. They are truly a "can do" team and I feel really fortunate that they said "yes" when I called and asked them to join the state team. You will hear more of our other District Deputy's, Directors and Chairmen as they are waiting to get out of the starting gate, show their stuff and establish new levels of accomplishment!

Finally, I would like to recognize our departing District Master of the Fourth Degree for an outstanding four years of leadership. Under PSD Phil Hahn's watch, 183 new Sir Knights and four new assemblies joined the Fourth Degree. I was fortunate to have served as his Marshall and participate in the exemplifications and installation of officers at many of the assemblies. We spent a lot of windshield time together where I gained tremendous respect for his passion and dedication to the Knights of Columbus. Brother Phil, please accept our deepest appreciation for your many contributions to the Knights of Columbus.

Please join me in welcoming PSD Max Nutt who has been named Phil's replacement as our new District Master. I look forward to working with Max as we team up to build and grow the Arkansas Jurisdiction. I am honored that Max has asked me to stay on as one of two or more Marshall's of the Fourth Degree. If, like us, you still get a chill when you hear or sing our National Anthem or thrill at reciting the Pledge of Allegiance, you too belong in the Fourth Degree!

or individual in need, something you hear on your local radio, notice in the church bulletin that a fellow parishioner is in need, your local Food Bank and your ST. Vincent DePaul Society. There are people in distress every day somewhere in our state, but we have to search them out

The most recent one was the result of a news article in the local newspaper where a member of the Police force and his family were on a mission of mercy to another state when his house was destroyed by lightning. They lost everything. It was a new home, lived in about nine months. Sure, they had insurance on the home and contents, but their immediate need was finding money for temporary housing, food and clothing for the family. .When the two checks, one from the council and one from the State 'Pennies from Heaven Fund, were presented to the officer, he was so grateful. He said he never knew that the Knights of Columbus was charitable to someone of his religion that he was going to present our actions to his church the following Sunday.

We lost a knight today. He didn't die an agonizing or sudden death. In fact we didn't even know he was ailing. He just wasn't around anymore and was not missed. But now he is gone. But you may see him walking around town still, for his body did not die. His spirit died. He was the one member who was initiated into our council, congratulated, and then never talked to again. Or maybe he was the energetic member who proposed many projects on the council floor but was never given any support, physical, or fraternal. First, his ideas, and then his enthusiasm, finally his spirit died. And he is no longer with us.

Why do we lose members, or why are they members by dues only, never seen? We lose members for one basic reason, not feeling wanted! Signs of not feeling wanted: a First Degree member is avoided by council members because he does not have the same interests, isn't in the same age bracket, has a personality or a handicap we feel uncomfortable with, has a different lifestyle, etc. Would you not feel wanted if you asked to be on a committee or ask to work at an activity and was told "No thanks, we already have our crew"? What if you go to a council dinner and want to sit with someone new and those at the table say, "We're saving these places for our friends"? Haven't we all had an opportunity to meet a new member but forgot our principles or charity and fraternity? Transferees from other councils may also suffer from these ailments because they have been accepted previously, but now suffer what they had never heretofore experienced?

What is the cure for this sickness? Let's employ our principles: Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. Not only welcome the member but make him feel welcomed, needed. Get him involved immediately, listen to his ideas, follow up on suggestions, and make him a part of the committee. If he is a First Degree member, encourage him to move up to Third Degree with the right of leadership (committee or officer). If

he is handicapped, don't show pity, but don't avoid him either. And above all, have patience with him because he may not be as fat or quick as you. He will sense this and will not want to be a burden no matter how much he wants to be a Knight. An involved member will be a healthy one. But be careful. You may find a new friend!

Remember, sickness can be healed. A healthy council will host healthy members. So let each of us look within ourselves to find possible improvement. We don't want to read in our next newsletter that we lost a member today.

## BISHOPS ASK CATHOLICS TO PRAY ELECTION NOVENA

WASHINGTON—The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) invites U.S. Catholics to pray before the November election a novena for life, justice, and peace called Novena for Faithful Citizenship. It is a podcast and available for download.

Joan Rosenhauer, Associate Director for the USCCB’s Department of Justice, Peace and Human Development, said that the special novena is part of “the bishops’ campaign to help Catholics develop

well-formed consciences for addressing political and social questions.” The bishops issued their statement on forming consciences for faithful citizenship in November 2007.

Helen Osman, USCCB Secretary of Communications, expressed hope that the novena could help “Catholics enter into prayerful reflection as they prepare to vote.” Seventy-one percent of all visitors to the USCCB’s web site download the free podcasts of the daily NAB readings. These same visitors are encouraged to use the novena podcast for prayer. Osman said that the USCCB wants to support Catholics as they weigh pre-election issues and that “providing a prayer resource on the Web can help us focus on our common values and identity as Catholics.” The novena emphasizes the dignity of life, justice, and peace.

The Novena for Faithful Citizenship runs for nine days and can be used consecutively, one day each week, for nine days prior to the election, or “in any way that works best for a community or individual,” said Rosenhauer.
