Recapping, we have started three new councils this fraternal year. They are the Mexican Martyrs Council 14609 in Rogers, the Father Abbot Raphael DeSalvo Council 14619 in Scranton and the Vietnamese Martyrs Council 14774 in Fort Smith. And we are in the final stages of reactivating Benton Council 09396. We sponsored each Diocese of Little Rock Seminarian at least once via the RSVP. We have an energetic program for Right to Life highlighted by providing ultrasound machines to pregnancy care centers via our soon-to-go statewide baby bottle campaigns, along with many other Right to Life activities in which we participate. Finally, with a little extra effort we could achieve a record number of Star Council Awards to emphasize the Star Quality of many of our councils.

To launch us into next fraternal year, we will have somewhere between 33 and 37 seminarians to sponsor via the RSVP. We should be able to purchase our half of our first ultrasound under the "Voice of the Unborn" program. Starting June 4, we are beginning our efforts to establish a new Hispanic Council at St. Theresa in Little Rock. Saturday June 6 will be the start of the new Forrest City Council/Roundtable with a First Degree. There is considerable new council development potential and the commitment is fermenting to make it happen.

To keep the momentum going and for our councils to get off to a great start next fraternal year, I hereby challenge each Grand Knight to Recruit One New Member in July. I would also encourage an early Financial Planning night with your Knights of Columbus Insurance Rep or General Agent Fred Ward. These two actions will give you an early lift off toward Star Council. Finally, I am confident that with the same support I had this year; we will be celebrating many achievements next year at our State Convention in Little Rock, April 23, 2010 through May 25, 2010 at the Crown Plaza.

## **VOCATIONS DIRECTOR**

Worthy Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators, District Deputies, and Brother Knights all:

Thank you and congratulations our Councils and Assemblies for contributing \$15,500.00 in \$500.00 RSVP's that go directly to the seminarians providing for incidentals and personal hygiene items. However, as generous as this is, it only represents 21 Councils and 6 Assemblies.

Under the gifted leadership of our Bishop Anthony Taylor and Diocesan Vocations Director Msgr. Scott Friend, we are being challenged to do more to keep up with God's blessings on the Diocese of Little Rock as we expect an increase of anywhere from 22% to 37% in new seminarians to a possible total of 37. This may very well be the highest per capita in the country.

Msgr. Scott Friend and his associates: Msgr. John O'Donnell and Fr. Erik Pohlmeier have done an excellent job of recruiting young men to answer their calling. Our Bishop Anthony Taylor has also been a part of the effort, as many of us know by his pictures and messages in the Arkansas Catholic.

It costs the Diocese of Little Rock \$32,000 to educate a seminarian each year. This far surpasses the earnings from the trust fund established for seminarian education. Thus, Bishop Taylor is adding \$75,000 from CASA funds to seminarian education and the newly instituted, annual Holy Thursday special collection for seminarian education. My request to the councils and assemblies who have participated in the RSVP,

please continue to participate. My appeal to the other councils and assemblies is to prayerfully consider joining those councils and assemblies that are participating in support our Diocese's good fortunes. This year I will be able to advise which seminarians are most in need of financial aid, but we are again committed to sponsor each seminarian at least once.

The time to send in your RSVP refund and Plaque applications is NOW – they need to be at the Supreme Office by June 30th. The refunds, of course, can be used towards next year's RSVP Awards. I have just recently received the annual report from Supreme on the RSVP contributions by Councils and Assemblies throughout all the jurisdictions. The report, however, is NOT complete for Arkansas. Some Councils did not send to Supreme or the State Vocations Chairman the RSVP – Plaque request (Form 2863A and Form 2863). Remember, if you do not submit the form you will not get your refund or the plaque. It is imperative that the forms and refund requests need to be submitted before the June 30<sup>th</sup> deadline. It's behooves each Council and Assembly keep me informed to be sure that they are getting the refunds and plaques that they have earned for their efforts.

The Holy Thursday second collection was for the seminarians. This was an effort to maintain sufficient funds to educate our future priests. I hope to have a proposal at the State Organizational Meeting for all councils and assemblies to participate in – in relation to continued support to maintain the educational burse for our seminarians. I would, at this time, ask for any suggestions from any Brother Knight.

The Voice of the Unborn Baby Bottle Campaign is in full swing. Francisco Olguin is selecting a parish and/or council to get the BBC started in Northwest Arkansas. John Hertzog took possession of 500 Baby Bottles at St. Jude's clubhouse in Jacksonville. St. Jude's has an outstanding Knights of Columbus clubhouse. St. Edward's Parish in Little Rock is working with their pastor for a date and St. Theresa's Parish is working on a June date. Looks like our days of moving the Voice of the Unborn BBC slowly from one parish to the next are past. We are now outfitted to do 3 to 5 parishes at a time depending on their size. Thanks to all the councils that contributed funds for the purchase of baby bottles to make this possible.

The following is an excerpt from a booklet titled Pro Life Answers. It is written by Mark Crutcher and distributed by Priests for Life:

Potential Argument: I am against abortion but I look at all the issues. Besides, most political offices have nothing to do with abortion.

For people who believe that abortion is murder, a candidate's position on other issues is irrelevant. The slaughter of children cannot be equated to any other social, cultural or political issue. It is also irrelevant that most political offices have no impact on abortion. If a candidate is a member of the KKK, voters will not ignore that just because the office he is seeking has no impact on racial issues. That dynamic also applies in this case. People who support legalized abortion are not morally qualified to serve in any public office.

It is interesting to note that the number of people killed during the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center is virtually the same as the number of unborn children killed daily in America's death camps (abortion mills). In other words, for the unborn every day is 9/11. If the rest of us were being hit like that, no one would be saying that there are other issues to consider.

"If a politician is wrong about the sanctity of human life, what can he be right about that makes up for it?"

Abortion is like a huge spiritual vortex of sin pulling people into it, and even the Church can be compromised by this evil too. All of this is to point out that abortion is a spiritual power that negates God's plan for love, life and the family.
