Because of the leadership of our Pro-Life Couple Marti and Jon Haslauer, we are very close to placing our first ultrasound in a pregnancy care center under Supreme's "Voice of the Unborn" Program. We have raised money via baby bottle campaigns, mostly in the Little Rock area, for ultrasounds and building our supply of baby bottles so we can expand the campaigns statewide. We are indebted to Jacksonville Council 11604 who blew the lid off their baby bottle campaign raising over \$8,000. After approval from your pastor, this is a great community service program for your council.

A top priority this next year is to combine the experience of our State Officers with eager District Deputies for council training. This will begin shortly after our Organizational Meeting on July 18 in Jacksonville. I assure you that the entire State Council is committed to the success of all our councils. This year has been great; next year will be even better.

New councils have been created and new Grand Knights have been elected, therefore it is deemed necessary to review the Stat Council's "Pennies From Heaven" Fund, its purpose, and procedures to request a grant from the fund.

This fund has been established by the State council as a one-time fund to assist those members of the order or of their families, members of their Parish or members of their communities who are in distress due to a sudden occurrence of nature (a terrible storm, tornado, or flood), an accident or a sickness that has caused a sudden loss of income or large medical bills, for example. They might also have suffered a total loss of housing and personal belongings due to fire. And yes, they do not have to even be Catholics, just someone who needs a "helping hand" in order that they may be able to begin to resume their life to where it was before the disaster.

Many individuals and/or families have been helped in their time of need by requests for grants of up to \$300.00 by various councils within the State in the past. We hope that all councils will be aware of those cases within their community that need this helping hand in the future and will submit their requests.

All it takes is for your grand knight to e-mail the requests for a grant from the State "Pennies From Heaven Fund" and a fast response will be forthcoming. We strive to respond to your request so that a check will be in the mail within two days to the grand knight for presentation, most likely much sooner than that. The Voice of the Unborn Baby Bottle Campaign is officially a success. Grand Knight James McClain, Financial Secretary John Hertzog and Program Director Michael Kieffer of St. Jude's Council 11064 and the parishioners of St. Jude's in Jacksonville have produced amazing results. They raised a record \$8,072.83 so far, not including the 125 bottles sent to the Chaplain of Little Rock Air Force Base. Our Worthy State Deputy is asking the Pope for special dispensation to clone Jacksonville Council 11064. Great Job! Currently St. Theresa's in Little Rock is collecting full baby bottles. Holy Souls Parish in Little Rock just received 725 empty baby bottles and will be passing them out on July 25th and July 26th. The decision has been made to place the first Ultrasound machine at St. Joseph's Helpers, Arkansas Pregnancy Resource Center in Little Rock. This is the Crisis Pregnancy Center supported by Christ The King in Little Rock and it is right across the street from Little Rock's only surgical abortion mill. St. Joseph's Helpers are on the front line saving babies from certain death every month. An ultrasound machine in their facility is sure to increase their great success.

On June 5th Bishop Anthony B. Taylor celebrated his 1st year as Bishop of the Diocese of Little Rock. On June 6th Bishop Taylor blessed the grand re-opening of St. Joseph's Helpers from their new location at #3 Office Park Drive Suite 101 Little Rock 72211 (in case anyone wants to send them a check). It seems like a small thing that they moved from Suite 102 to Suite 101. However, this move actually gained them an entrance and windows facing the abortion mill so they can see what is going on from inside their offices. Moving from one side of the building to the other will help them save even more lives going forward. It's an excellent time for the Knights of Columbus to be bringing them an Ultrasound Machine.

Dear Friends,

Babies are being saved through our ongoing prayer and sidewalk counseling ministry. Let me share a few of the stories with you. The following are told in the voice of the sidewalk counselor or prayer volunteer.

At 9:55 AM a white Caucasian client came in. She looked far along, and I gave her booties. I told her she was really showing and she took a flyer on fetal development. I told her to make sure she asked for an ultra sound and to look at it. She was in there 1/2 hour, came out and stopped on the way out still pregnant...**5 months!!** We talked and she is considering **adoption. She cried. She** could not believe her eyes when she saw her baby on the ultrasound!

Young couples were there early waiting to get in. I spoke to them all and specified that tomorrow was Father's Day, and they could opt to go home and enjoy it instead of feeling empty...etc. One young couple went in and an hour later came out. I went to their car to give them a brochure and noticed the girl crying and her husband (young couple) said that she had not gone through it. When they did the ultrasound she saw the baby and just could not go through with it. The young man said I remembered what you said about celebrating Father's Day and I just could not do it either. I took them over to St. Joseph's and tended to the girl (19 years) who was vomiting. Showed them the center and the dad (young lad too) chose a blanket to take for their new baby. Mom took diapers for their 2 year old. We got to discussing why they had resorted to have an abortion...all due to financial situations...could not afford another child. She wants to go to nursing school in August. They were behind on their rent, and now, more because the clinic took \$200.00 because they did not go through with the abortion. They will now be behind in rent, short \$375.00 so St. Joseph Helpers will help them. I offered all our assistance and they were so happy! I sent them home with ice, water and paper towels...they had no air conditioner.

I was there praying when a young girl arrived with her boyfriend and her Father. After parking and putting their belongings in their car, the boyfriend, noting how hot it was, brought me a water bottle. I asked him if they were here for an abortion. He said yes, that was his girlfriend. I told him he was a Daddy and his girlfriend was already a Mommy and about the reality of losing their child through abortion and the regrets they might have. He went back up to where his girlfriend and her Father were standing, and they all got in the car and left. They didn't speak to the prayer warrior, but their actions were cause for great rejoicing.



There have been several other babies saved since the Spring 40 Days for Life ended and our ongoing prayer started. Thank you so much to those of you praying week after week. We are doing an amazing job covering Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.

I appreciate all your work for the Knights of Columbus and if I can be of any help, let me know.

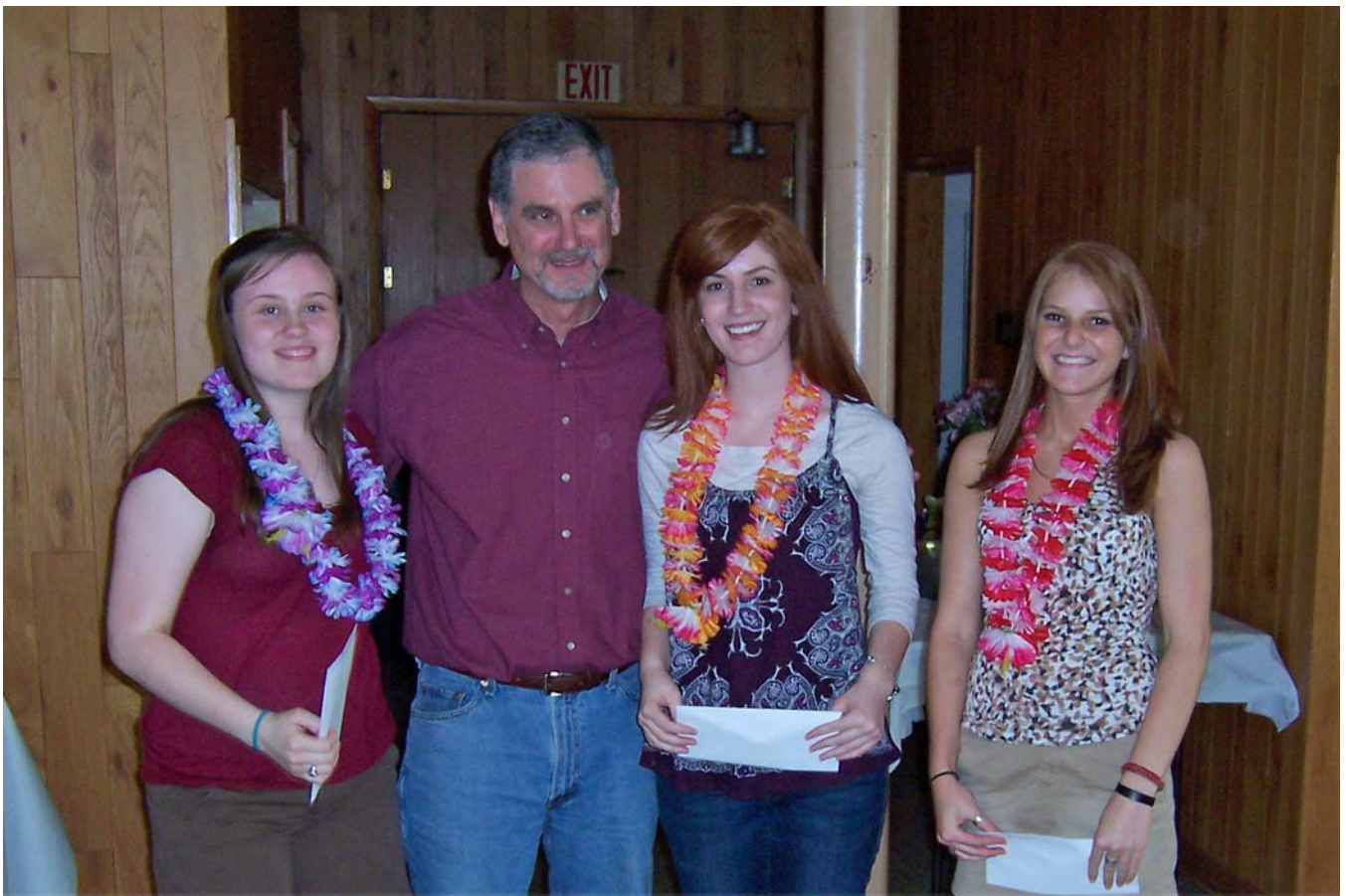
