SACRED HEART OF JESUS PRO-LIFE INITIATIVE
VOICE FOR THE UNBORN - BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN
JANUARY 17 – 31, 2010

A pro-life initiative is being conducted at Sacred Heart of Jesus. The start of this campaign is set to coincide with the January 17 Mass and the March for Life in Little Rock. It is called the Voice for the Unborn - Baby Bottle Campaign which solicits financial contributions to help purchase ultrasound machines to be strategically placed in crisis pregnancy centers throughout Arkansas and to assist with related expenses. *Data show that over 75% of abortion-minded women who see an image of their unborn baby will choose life.*

Baby bottles will be handed out after all masses on January 16 and 17 to serve as a tangible reminder of this campaign. Financial contributions should be placed in the bottle and dropped off at the designated location in the narthex during the next two weeks. Additional bottles (or envelopes) will also be available in the narthex for those who do not receive a bottle after one of the masses. Checks should be made payable to Sacred Heart of Jesus and designated for the Baby Bottle Campaign (BBC).

This campaign is a joint effort between the pro-life programs of both Sacred Heart of Jesus and the local Knights of Columbus Council. The International Knights of Columbus will cover one-half of the cost of an ultrasound machine for a pro-life pregnancy center. In fact, the 8th machine that the Knights helped to place through this nationwide program was at St. Joseph's Helpers/Arkansas Pregnancy Resource Center (3 Office Park Drive, Suite 101) across the street from the abortion clinic in downtown Little Rock. This location and all future ones in Arkansas are chosen in consultation with Marianne Linane of the Diocese of Little Rock Respect Life Office. The next ultrasound machine will most likely be placed in Fayetteville AR.

Besides the initial cost of an ultrasound machine (approximately \$16,000), there are the additional expenses associated with meeting Arkansas' medical regulatory requirements, including malpractice insurance and the employment of a certified technician on site to operate the machine. Therefore, some of the funds collected from this campaign will assist Arkansas pregnancy centers in meeting these requirements.

Remember:

- All money collected will be used in Arkansas pregnancy centers for ultrasound machines and associated operational expenses.
- *Over 75% of abortion-minded women who see an image of their unborn baby choose life.*
- The deadline for contributions is Sunday, January 31.

THE 40 DAYS FOR LIFE PRAYER CAMPAIGN

Hello to all of you,

Well, the 40 Days for Life prayer campaign to end abortion is ready to kick-off again, on Ash Wednesday, February 17th. I apologize for the delay in contacting you, but one of our challenges when Marti Haslauer passed the torch as coordinator to me was getting all of her contacts into my computer! I know that many of you are already aware of the spring campaign, but as this campaign's coordinator, I wanted to introduce myself and invite you to: PRAY, FAST and STAND IN PUBLIC WITNESS throughout this prayer campaign for an end to abortion in our city and state.

This year we will have only one official 40 Days site, at LR Family Planning Services, #4 Office Park Drive in west Little Rock. We will pray from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM February 17 to March 28. To date, 32 days have been adopted by churches or groups so we are off to a great start. Check our website www.40daysforlife.com/littlerock to sign up for at least one hour a week to pray or see if your church has adopted a day. Or, if your church has a Respect Life contact person, let her/him know when you can pray and your name will be added to the vigil calendar. If your church has not adopted a day or day to pray, consider doing it yourself and asking your friends to help you fill the hours with silent prayer.

If your schedule is flexible and you can help by being a substitute, please let me know. We will kick-off our campaign on Ash Wednesday, February 17th at 2:00 PM at the abortion facility. Please remember to park across Hermitage Drive at the Financial Center parking lot whenever you come to our events or to pray.

Thank you for being a part of this important ministry to save lives. We need you!

RESOLUTIONS AND RULES FOR CANDIDATES FOR STATE OFFICE.

Worthy State Officers and Grand Knights:

A resolution is a formal statement of a decision or expression of opinion put forth and adopted by the delegates of the State Convention. Resolutions handle a variety functions. They restore old policies, propose new ideas, present new procedures, and help set budgets and direct expenditures. Also they can express gratitude to those who deserve such an honor. Because of their importance to the well being of the State Council, serious thought must be given to each resolution. All resolutions are enacted for only one year. An "old" resolution must be re-submitted and voted upon annually.

A proposed resolution may be presented to the State Convention by any Knights of Columbus member in the state. Correct procedures, however, must be followed. The member must first present the proposed resolution to his local council. The council members must approve the proposed resolution. It is then sent to the State Advocate preferably by Email at OceanPoolsSpas@aol.com. In the event the Grand Knight has no Internet access please work with the DGK or FS to use Email if possible. The proposed resolution must bear the signature of the Grand Knight. Please send your resolutions by Email and then follow up with a hard copy by mail of the resolution bearing the signature of the Grand Knight. *ALL RESOLUTIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE STATE ADVOCATE NO LATER THAN 28 FEBRUARY, 2010. AGAIN, THE DEADLINE FOR RESOLUTIONS IS 28 FEBRUARY, 2010 TO BE CONSIDERED FOR THE 2010 STATE CONVENTION.* All proposed resolutions will be compiled and Emailed to the Grand Knights by the end of March, 2010 so councils may discuss the resolutions at their April meetings.

State officers may propose resolutions. The proposed resolution must be submitted using the above mentioned methods to the State Advocate no later than 28 February, 2010 to be considered for the 2010 State Convention.

If you have any questions regarding the procedure for submitting resolutions for consideration at the State Convention to be held in Little Rock April 23, 24 and 25, 2010 please contact me at Cell 479-263-7464 or Office 479-770-5609.

The accepted Rules of Conduct for a candidate seeking a state office states that all candidates must be nominated by their local council. Letters sent to other councils must come from the candidate's home council and be signed by the Grand Knight. It is improper to "advertise" a candidate in any public location before or during the convention. This rule will be strictly adhered to and enforced for this convention.

Hard copies bearing the Grand Knight's signature should be sent by United State Mail to Mike Mitchell, 21758 Gann Rd., Gentry, AR 72734.

Thank you in advance for the hard work you will do proposing resolutions and especially for your timely response submitting the to the State Advocate's office. Using Email will speed the response time in distributing these resolutions across the state. So please, try to use Email if possible followed up by a hard copy in the US mail.

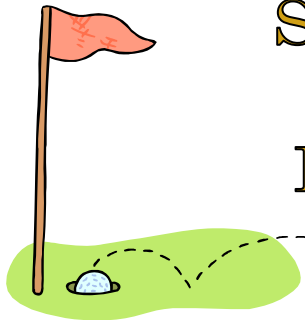
